



Grace LES Partners with Ladies Aid for Service Project

This year our fall service project will be preparing and donating hygiene bags, unused socks (white athletic), unused t-shirts (white, grey, or black; plain), and blankets to our community partner, CASS- Central Arizona Shelter Services.

CASS is located one block South of Grace, and services Glendale's homeless population. Our school children and Ladies Aid are asking for donations of small toiletries; shampoo, soap, lip balm, deodorant, toothpaste, and toothbrushes for these hygiene bags. Please NO full size products. The students will also be making blankets. We will meet the morning of November 23 to assemble the items, and will conclude with fellowship and pie. ALL members of the congregation are welcome to join us for this event.

In years past, the school has selected St. Mary's Food Bank as our charity to kick off the holiday giving season. We will not be donating to them this year, as we have chosen to partner with organizations who serve our immediate and surrounding neighborhood. What better area to serve than our own! We are very happy to take food donations in addition to toiletries, shirts, and socks. Any food donations received will be distributed to West Valley Food Pantry. There will be boxes for donations in the narthex and in fellowship hall, beginning October 9.

We have received a \$250 grant from WELS Christian Aid and Relief, which would be pleased if our members could match it. You may designate your offering to Grace LES Service and Pie Project. Your donations will be used to purchase materials to construct blankets and for the bags and packaging of those items.
