Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Last Sunday the Candle of Peace was lit. We light the Candle of Peace and the Candle of Hope again today as we remember that Christ will come again and bring to the world everlasting peace.

(The candles of Hope and Peace are lit.)

The third candle of Advent is the Candle of Joy. It reminds us of the joy that Mary felt when the angel Gabriel told her that a special child would be born to her – a child who would save and deliver his people.

God wants us all to have joy. The angel who announced to the shepherds that Jesus has been born told them: "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people – Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord." We light this candle to remember that Christ brings the promise of a new life – a life in which the blind receive sight, the lame walk, and the prisoners are set free. We light it to remember that He is the bringer of true and everlasting joy.






Lord's Prayer
