When the Lord had someone anointed, he also poured his Spirit over them. It was the fulfillment of promises made over centuries.*

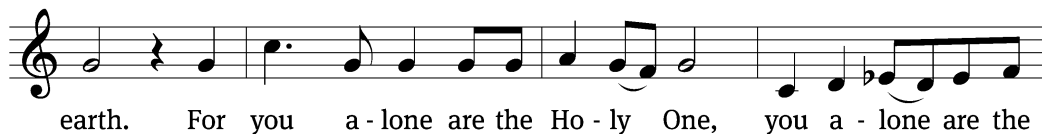
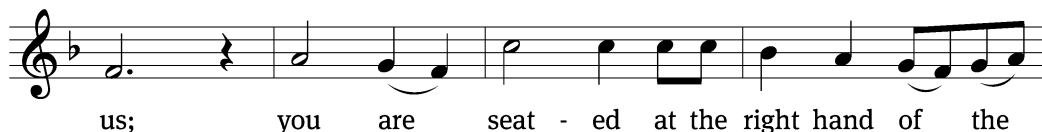

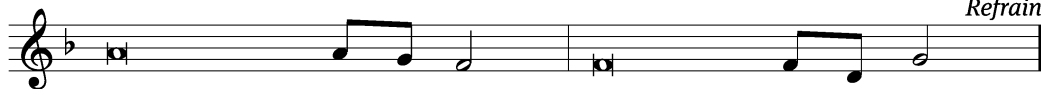

While the rapid spread of Christianity across the Greek- and Latin-speaking Mediterranean world is well-known, few people are aware that an equally rapid spread took place eastwards in the Syriac language. Not only did this result in Christian churches in India by the second century, but a church body in China by the seventh century.
